

EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT

HEALTH & IFE SKILLS

THE NEED: "For every child in after school in California, 3 are waiting for an available program" (Afterschool Alliance)

WHAT WE DO: UBGC offers a wide range of educational tools and resources, such as Power Hour and Freckle, to assist members with homework completion and individualized tutoring.

OUR IMPACT: By adapting to each child's learning style as well as tracking and rewarding their educational progress, UBGC ensures that all members feel confident in the classroom. This leads to increased grades over time, along with higher graduation rates.

THE NEED: "16.7% of youth in the county (16,580 children) are food insecure" (FeedingAmerica.org)

WHAT WE DO: UBGC's Zero Hunger Food Program served 107,933 meals to youth members in 2021 at no additional cost to members.

OUR IMPACT: Consuming balanced, healthy meals ensures our members have the brain power they need to learn and be active. UBGC aims to support families through free meals after school, during the summer months, and over the holidays.

LEADERSHIP MENTORING

THE NEED: "In California, more than 600,000 kids were alone and unsupervised between the hours of 3-6pm in 2020" (Afterschool Alliance)

WHAT WE DO: The clubs offer a wide range of resources to assist with mentoring, such as our Be A Star anti-bullying program, as well as our College Bound program that assists members with the college selection and application process.

OUR IMPACT: UBGC provides a safe and structured environment where all members have the opportunity to receive one-on-one attention. Staff helps teach kids about emotional intelligence, aids in workforce readiness, and offers support throughout the college application and financial aid processes. This ensures our kids are set up for success in whatever path they choose after leaving the clubs.

Soul of the Club

Damian, Age 10

Damian has been attending the Downtown Boys and Girls Club for the last 3 years and from day one, he jumped in with both feet. Throughout his time as a member, Damian has been involved in our after school program, sports, and various field trips. Even during the summer months, he joins us for our 10-week Summer Spectacular Program; a true club kid in every sense of the word. Over time, staff members have gotten the opportunity to know him as an energetic, spirited kid who takes pride in his ability to make people of all ages double over with laughter.

While schools were forced to close during the pandemic, Damian showed up to the club every day to attend his zoom classes and complete his schoolwork. Most days, Damian would choose to stay for our after school program too, often spending nearly 9 hours a day at the club. In that time, we saw him form great friendships with other members as well as meaningful relationships with staff. Now, Damian flies off the bus each day eager to greet all of the new friends the club has to offer, never shying from a new child or staff member.

Damian has also shown personal growth during his time on the basketball team, where he currently serves as a vital team leader. He stands out on the court as a talented player and hard worker, but his biggest impact on the team has been his inclination to make all of his teammates feel included, regardless of age or skill level.

In 2021, Damian came in first place on our member list for the highest club attendance, coming to the club for 227 days out of a total 238 days open. During this time, he has made strides on how he handles himself during times of conflict. On many occasions, staff members made calls home to address Damian's behavioral concerns with his parents. By regularly checking in on Damian and working in tandem with his parents, the clubs have helped him advance his understanding of compromise and emotional intelligence. Staff have noticed that he is now taking ownership of his actions and is honest with staff when situations arise, even on the occasions where he knows he's at fault. We are confident that Damian's positive outlook and animated personality will set him up for success long after he leaves the club.

It takes years of empathy, consistency, and patience to help our members grow into the people we know they are meant to become and you are a fundamental part of that journey.

1938 Legacy Society

In 1938, community members devised a plan to provide after-school programming for youth in Santa Barbara and founded the Boys Club of Santa Barbara. Here at United Boys & Girls Club, our story began in a small abandoned firehouse with only 11 kids, and today we now have grown to serve over 5,000 youth throughout Santa Barbara County. Our founders came up with a plan, and through many decades, thousands of supporters have grown our organization to where it is today. Generations of




OPERATING EXPENSES
